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## **OVERVIEW AND PURPOSE**

The purpose of this document is to provide Kaipara District Council (KDC) with a concept masterplan for the recently purchased Urlich Park with the aim to create a further sporting and community precinct for Mangawhai Town, incorporating a new Public Library and Community Hub.

The masterplan document considers the current Mangawhai Town community facilities, the existing open space environment, significant vegetation and existing and proposed transport links, providing context to the Urlich Park site. It also provides a climate and environmental analysis of the site, with a focus on current flood data and water management. A thorough site analysis looks at the existing features and topography which informs a park programming diagram that outlines the park's potential functions and opportunities.

Based on the Topic 2 community consultation and park programming options, a masterplan concept / development outcome has been proposed for review / workshop with KDC.

## **Existing Site**

The existing Urlich Park site is currently a 5.8ha grazed farm paddock. It sits on the corner of Moir Sreet and Urlich Drive and opposite Mangawhai Domain which is community sport facility hosting weekend, Soccer, Cricket and Tennis.

The site has three existing farm shelters / sheds in varying condition and also shallow farm drains running through the centre of the site.

The site topography is predominantly flat, with a gently sloping hill / embankment to the northeast corner. The existing trees and vegetation are mostly exotic consisting of willows dotted around the flat land and a very large macrocarpa on the hill. There is a long thin band of mixed trees and shrubs along the Moir Street boundary. There are no notable trees or vegetation worthy of retention.



Option 2 - Sports and Recreation Hub




Alternative programming options could be explored. Option 1 with the Library and Sports and Recreation Hub and Option 2 with only the Sports and Recreation Hub.

## Potential Sports Assessment

#### TOPIC 2

The sporting assessment for Urlich Park comes from two sources. The first is the Topic 2 community consultation on the KDC Long Term Plan 2024-2027. The purpose of this was to create a more focused needs assessment with key stakeholders to determine the kinds of sports and recreational facilities are required to ensure current and future needs are met in readiness for the concept design work. The question that was posed was:

What kinds of sports and recreational facilities do you want to see developed in Urlich Park (Moir Street Reserve)?



These results are very useful for an initial assessment and to undertake a bulk and location masterplan concept for the park.

The following sport and activities have chosen for this initial masterplan:

- Athletics track
- Netball courts
- Rugby field
- Outdoor sports fields / touch rugby / training pitch
- Indoor facilities / Indoor courts / Community hub
- Walking and biking trails
- Parks and reserves
- · Integration of new Public Library
- Parking

There will be many crossover sports and community activities that can run in conjunction with the above selections.

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## Potential Sports Assessment

#### SPORTS AND RECREATION HUB

The second assessment has come from the advice from Sport Northland to create a Sports and Recreation Hub in Mangawhai to undertake further community and stakeholder engagement.

#### What is a Sports and Recreation Hub?

A sports and recreation hub is a physical facility, or collection of facilities including buildings, fields, courts etc as a "hub" and clubs or other organisations working in partnership either virtually or within physical infrastructure to share expertise in governance and management structure.

A sports and recreation hub is "A partnership where organisations collaborate and share expertise, programmes, facilities and/or services strategically, sometimes via an independently governed group, within a defined geographical area, to provide sustainable, quality sport and recreation experiences" (https://sportnz.org.nz/resources/the-hub-guide/)

#### Sports and recreation Hubs involve working in partnership

A partnership is a collaborative relationship between organisations for mutual benefit. Partnership is about working together and any discussion about partnership in sport in New Zealand generally requires an understanding that ALL partners are considered equal from the outset, regardless of the significance of resources they might bring to the partnership.

#### MANGAWHAI SPORTS AND RECREATION HUB

Sport New Zealand provide step by step guidance for creating a sports and recreation hub. The process of developing the more comprehensive masterplan for Urlich Park would need to undertake a number of the key steps in developing a sports hub.

are needed, to begin the process of creating sports and recreation hub governance and partnerships in which to inform a robust and comprehensive masterplan for Urlich Park.
