

Rates Postponement and Remission Policy adopt for consultation

Purpose/Ngā whāinga

To adopt for consultation the draft rates postponement and remission policy.

Executive summary/Whakarāpopototanga

Minor changes have been made to the existing rates postponement and remission policy which reflect the changes to the organisation structure as well as assisting clarity and administration of the policies.

Recommendation/Ngā tūtohunga

That the Kaipara District Council:

- a) Approves the draft Rates Postponement and Remission Policy for consultation (Attachment A).
- d) Authorises the Chief Executive to make minor edits or changes to the Policy to correct any spelling errors or to make typographical edits, and/or to reflect decisions made by Council at this meeting.

Context/Horopaki

The Local Government Act 2002 (LGA) provides that a Council <u>must</u> adopt a policy on the postponement and remission of rates on Māori freehold land, and that a Council <u>may</u> adopt a rates remission policy and/or a rates postponement policy.

Adopted policies must be reviewed at least once every 6 years, using a consultation process that gives effect to the requirements of section 82 LGA.

Kaipara District Council policies were last reviewed in November 2017 and these were adopted alongside the Long Term Plan in 2018.

Discussion/Ngā korerorero

Māori Freehold Land Rates Postponement and Remission Policy

Council indicated at the October briefing that it is appropriate to review this policy after Parliament complete their review of the amended Rating of Whenua Māori Amendment Bill.

Existing Rates Postponement and Remission Policy

This Policy received minor changes during the last review in 2017. With the recent changes to the organisational structure it is timely to amend any reference to the General Manager Finance to that of General Manager Sustainable Growth and Investment.

Given that the policies are generally working well, Council indicated at the October briefing that only a minor review of the existing policies is appropriate. To that end a few wording changes that



don't impact the fundamental principles of the policies, but that assist with clarity and administration have been made. These changes can be seen in the document in Attachment A.

Options

- a) i) Council adopts the Rates Postponement and Remission Policy for consultation (Attachment A)
 - ii) Authorises the Chief Executive to make minor edits or changes to the Policy to correct any spelling errors or make typographical edits, and/or to reflect decisions made by Council at this meeting.

Policy and planning implications

This Policy is required to be reviewed in accordance with the Local Government Act 2002.

Financial implications

The Rates Postponement and Remission Policy provides financial assistance and support to ratepayers. There are no additional financial implications associated with the minor amendments that are proposed.

Risks and mitigations
