

Externally Funded Projects update - February 2024

Purpose | Ngā whāinga

To provide an update to Elected Members on the externally funded projects.

Executive summary | Whakarāpopototanga

The Government have various programmes in place, some ongoing and others discrete that periodically release funds to Councils for projects that meet their funding criteria. The funding programmes include:

- Infrastructure Reference Group Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE)
- Provincial Growth Fund (MBIE)
- Department of Internal Affairs Reform packages
- Tourism Infrastructure (TIF)
- Climate Emergency Response through Waka Kotahi
- Local Government Flood Resilience Co-investment Fund

The funding provided to Council from these sources can range from the full cost of the proposed project to a co-funding option where a portion of the project cost will be borne by Council.

Council has 22 current capital projects that have received external funding approval. Six projects are in the construction phase with 16 projects in the earlier phases.

There have been two rounds of funding for the Local Government Flood Resilience Co-investment Fund (flood resilience fund) out of the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) open for application. Four of our storm recovery projects were successfully included in round 1 and three projects were successful in the round 2 announcement received late January.

This report is the first in the new format proposed in December 2023. Please note there are no status reports for projects in the construction phase as there has been no update since those issued in December.

Context | Horopaki

Since 2019, Council has received funding from external sources for various projects.

To ensure Elected Members are up to date with the status and progress of each project with approved funding, a summary update will be provided periodically with the latest project status report for each project in the construction stage included.



Discussion | Ngā kōrerorero

The Government have various programmes in place, some ongoing and others discrete that periodically release funds to Councils for projects that meet their funding criteria. The funding programmes include:

- Infrastructure Reference Group Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE)
- Provincial Growth Fund MBIE
- Department of Internal Affairs Reform packages
- Tourism Infrastructure Fund (TIF)
- Climate Emergency Response through Waka Kotahi
- Local Government Flood Resilience Co-investment Fund

The external funding ranges from 50% to 100% of the proposed project cost, with Council required to co-fund the project cost that does not attract external funding. Funding may also be available from Waka Kotahi. The funding allocation for the currently approved projects can be seen in the matrix below (see next page).

Pahi public toilet relocation and upgrade has a completed design and a delivery programme established. The funding agreement is being finalised with MBIE so construction can begin.

Waka Kotahi's Climate Emergency Response Fund programme funds projects in the Transport Choices package with the Dargaville cycle lane and shared pathway originally approved and in the planning phase. This project was known as the Kaipara Cycle Network Connections project and has been ceased as of December 2023 when the funding availability was withdrawn.



Department of Internal Affairs (DIA) – reform packages

The first tranche of the 'Better off' Fund (which supports local government to invest in the wellbeing of their communities) where \$4.04m has been approved for the development of community centres in Mangawhai and Dargaville. Following consideration of various alternative options for the allocation of these funds once the second tranche of this funding became no longer available, the consensus has been to continue with the concept, community engagement, design and consenting for these community centres.

The internal planning for this is now in flight, with recruitment of a Project Manager currently underway.
