

Externally funded projects update report – May 2024

Purpose | Ngā whāinga

To provide an update to elected members on the externally funded projects.

Executive summary | Whakarapopototanga

The Government have various programmes in place, some ongoing and others discrete that periodically release funds to Councils for projects that meet their funding criteria. The funding programmes include:

- Infrastructure Reference Group Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE)
- Provincial Growth Fund (MBIE)
- Department of Internal Affairs Reform packages
- Tourism Infrastructure (TIF)
- Climate Emergency Response through Waka Kotahi
- Local Government Flood Resilience Co-investment Fund

The funding provided to Council from these sources can range from the full cost of the proposed project to a co-funding option where a portion of the project cost will be borne by Council.

Council has 21 current capital projects that have received external funding approval. Eight projects are in the construction or closure phases with 13 projects in the earlier phases.

From the last report three projects have moved into the closure stage (Kaihu Valley Trail, Pouto Wharf and Dargaville to Te Kopuru Stopbank) and one (Pahi toilets) has moved into construction.

There have been no new rounds of funding available to apply for and in April the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA) advised a change to the Better off Funding projects. An agenda item outlining this is included in this Council Meeting agenda.

Mangawhai Shared Path updates will be via the monthly NTA activity update.

Context | Horopaki

Since 2019, Council has received funding from external sources for various projects.

To ensure Elected Members are up to date with the status and progress of each project with approved funding, a summary update will be provided periodically with the latest project status report for each project in the construction stage included.



Discussion | Ngā kōrerorero

The Government have various programmes in place, some ongoing and others discrete that periodically release funds to Councils for projects that meet their funding criteria. The funding programmes include:

- Infrastructure Reference Group Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE)
- Provincial Growth Fund MBIE
- Department of Internal Affairs Reform packages
- Tourism Infrastructure Fund (TIF)
- Climate Emergency Response through Waka Kotahi
- Local Government Flood Resilience Co-investment Fund

The external funding ranges from 50% to 100% of the proposed project cost, with Council required to co-fund the project cost that does not attract external funding. Funding may also be available from Waka Kotahi. The funding allocation for the currently approved projects can be seen in the matrix below.

Three projects have moved into the closure/completion phase since the last report – Kaihu Valley Trail, Pouto Wharf and the Dargaville to Te Kopuru stopbank and procurement is progressing well with a further three projects contracted.

Pahi public toilet relocation and upgrade has a completed design and a delivery programme established. The funding agreement is being finalised with MBIE so construction can begin.

Four pieces of work have been identified under the umbrella of the Dargaville stopbank repairs funding with Geotech assessment underway for items 1, 2 & 4 noted below:

- 1. River Road stopbank and road repair
- 2. River Road (SH12) stopbank repair
- 3. Victoria St near the band rotunda
- 4. Beach Rd near the intersection with Day St
